


Whilst we are not expecting you to replicate school at home, it will be important that you all try to do some learning each school day to keep your skills up.


Each school day you should try to:


- Practice your spellings words. You can use look, cover, write, check as well as having a go at using some of the words in sentences of your own.

would be written where they got 'em once covered an Earthling's bottom! and how such funny underwear And on the label beneath


when the weekend wash had been done, to be dried by the morning sun. They came on a Monday night pegged out on the line


when aliens snatched my underpants-I'm glad that they were clean! was a witness at the scene Mrs Driver from next door




- Give yourself 1 point for each new word you can think of.
