I'm glad that they were clean!



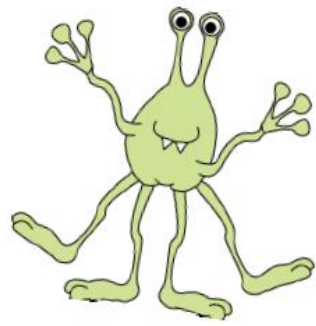
It seems they were quite choosy

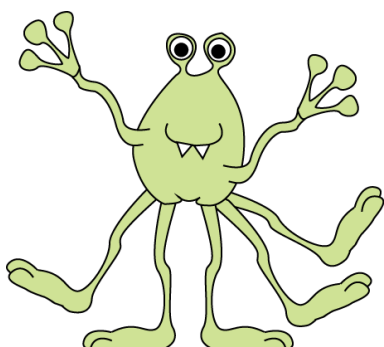

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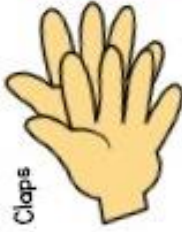
