
Whilst we are not expecting you to replicate school at home, it will be important that you all try to do some learning each school day to keep your skills up.





Last week some of the online Maths sessions were making amounts and comparing money. Add these mixed amounts of \pounds and p just like you have done in class.


















Read the story, highlight the words with the **igh** trigraph and answer the questions in full sentences.


1. Why did Andy and Mandy sail out to sea?
