Can you draw a detailed picture of the character inside the tree?



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


## Who lives here?

Read the poem out loud. Did you notice that it asks a question in each verse?

Using the poem as a pattern and using your own ideas you are going to create your own 'Who lives here?' poem. You will draw the animals you choose in their homes first.

Fold a piece of plain A4 paper in half and then fold it in half again to create four sections. Draw four of your own animals' homes in the four sections on the paper. Then draw the animal or insect in their home with a speech bubble saying 'This is my home!' Then use your 4 pages to write your own 'Who lives here?' poem using the same pattern as the one below.



# Make your own musical instrument!

#### What to do

- Look at your collected materials together and explore the different sounds you can make by hitting, scraping, shaking and plucking (wind instruments are much harder than they look!).
- Explore combining materials to make new sounds (rice in a crisp tube to make a shaker, elastic bands stretched over a box can be plucked, paper, cellophane or a balloon pulled over a jar to make a drum, etc.)
- You can enjoy keeping the materials fixed in temporary ways to allow for continual rebuilding and design changes or fix more permanently to make an instrument which can be decorated, played with and performed with.

#### What you need

Recycled packaging (such as boxes, tins, tubes, plastic tubs, paper, paper cups, jar lids, tins, bottle tops, cellophane wrappers).

Things to make shaker filling (e.g. rice, sand)

String, elastic bands, ribbons, balloons

Pencils as beaters
