Here are some suggestions for home learning tasks over the next week in particular and after if you would like.

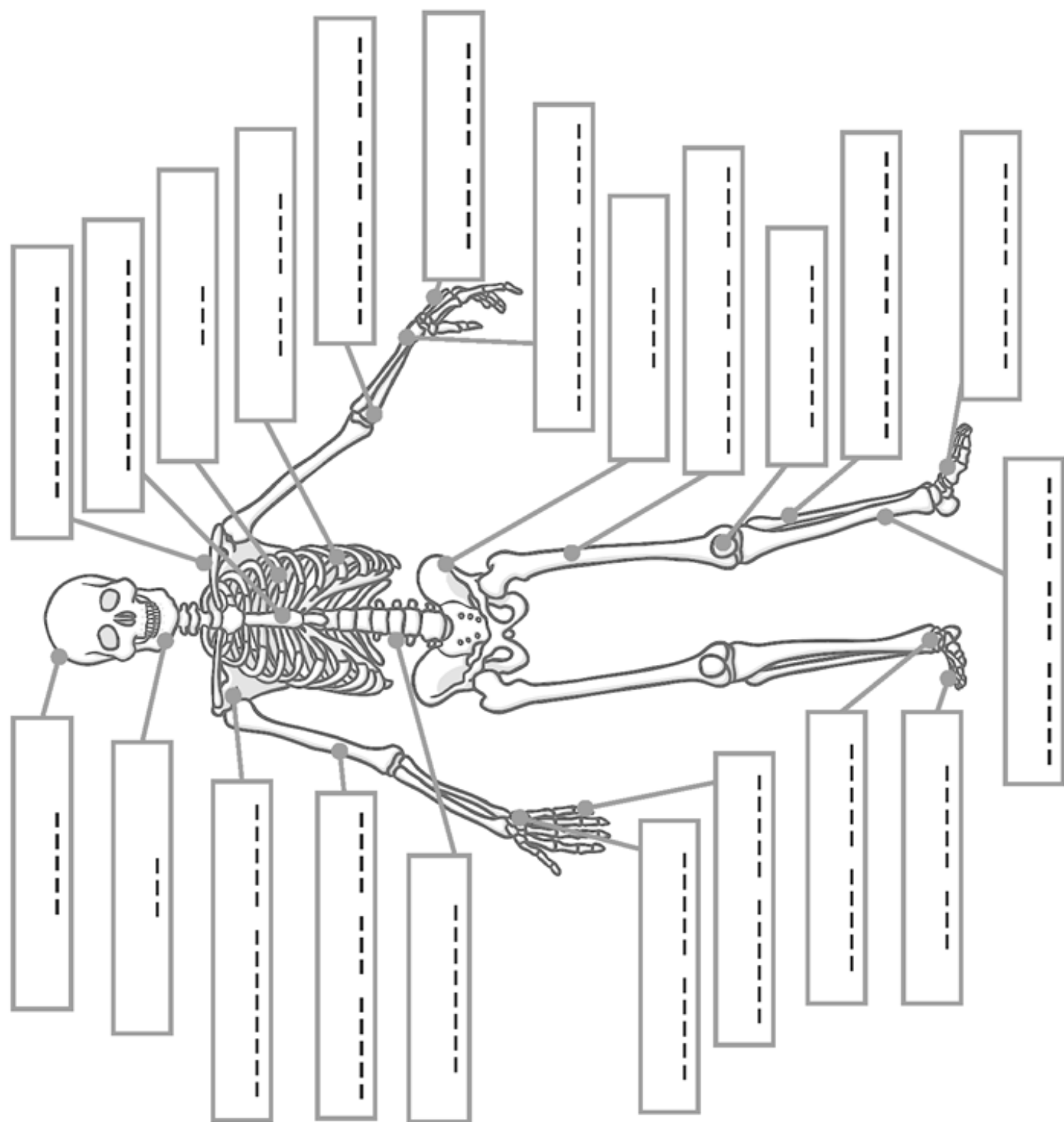

Please continue reading daily, practising times tables and spellings.

Write a newspaper report about something you have done recently. Remember to include who, what, why, where, when.	Rewrite a book that you have read as a picture book for a younger audience.
Read every day for a week. Keep a record of what you have been reading.	How many different ways can you think of that people can find out news? List them and explain which you think is best and why.
Choose 10 words you know you don't always spell correctly. Practise them every day. Ask someone to test you at the beginning and the end of the week.	Create an alternative headline for a newspaper article. Is it better than the original headline? Why or why not?

<p>Find at least 5 different containers for liquids around your home (e.g. shampoo bottle, drinks, washing-up liquid etc). Write how much liquid each container holds when full. Sort the containers from smallest to largest capacity.</p>	<p>Make a timetable of at least 8 different activities you do during the day, and the time you do them. Draw a clock for each time. Try to include some quarter past and quarter to times. Can you challenge yourself to use 5, 10 or 20 to or past as well?</p>
<p>Make a poster teaching someone in Year 2 how to tell the time on an analogue clock.</p>	<p>Find at least 5 different food packages around your home. Write the mass each contains when full. Sort them from smallest to largest mass.</p>
<p>Go on a shape hunt around your home. What shapes can you find? Draw them in your book and don't forget to describe the properties of the shapes.</p>	<p>Spend at least 5 minutes every day for a week practising your times tables. Get an adult to sign your home learning book when you have completed this.</p>
<p>Log on to Times Table Rockstars to practise your times tables every day for a week. Get an adult to sign your home learning book when you have completed this.</p>	<p>Create a poster all about adding or subtracting. Be as creative as you like!</p>

<p>Find out about the bones in the skeleton. Can you label the attached diagram? Why do we have bones?</p>	<p>Find out about the muscles in your body. Why is important to warm up before any physical activity?</p>
