Maths

Building on our strong
understanding of place value, we
will be working with larger
numbers (to 20) this half term.
Accurately naming the teen
numbers can be a challenge for
some children so please support
them with this at home. We will
order numbers, partition them
into tens and ones and add and
subtract numbers to 20.

History

Our topic this half term is linked to Space. We will be learning all about the first moon landing, the countries involved, where it fits on a timeline of events we know about and some of the people who made it happen, including Neil Armstrong and Katherine Johnson.

PE

Our focus this half term is: FUNS5 Dynamic Balance FUNS4 Static Balance

RE

Focussing on the concept of 'belonging' we will be thinking about what makes people belong to a community, including in Christianity.

Phonics

We will continue learning Phase 5 graphemes which give us alternate spellings for sounds we already know. Keep practising with your sound mats, reading books and on Bug Club!

PSHE

Our over-arching topic this term is 'living in the wider world.' We will begin by considering what it means to belong to a community: roles, responsibilities, equality and inclusion. We will then move on to think about the value of the internet in everyday life and how we can use it to learn whilst considering that what we read online may not always be true.

Science

We will be continuing our learning from
Autumn 2 on the different types of materials.
We will learn the differences between
materials and their properties. We will
observe changes in the weather over the
term and use our knowledge of the wider
world to understand seasonal changes. We will
investigate day length and how it varies over
the year.

Computing

Using the beebots, we will be learning how to program: to predict the outcome of a command on a device and to give a device a series of commands in order.

English

This half term, our English work will be based around 'Man on the Moon' by Simon Bartram. We will be supporting the children to develop their writing by using joining words (e.g. and) to write longer sentences. We will be concentrating especially hard on making sure we are using capital letters and full stops correctly, and continuing to focus on spelling familiar and unfamiliar words with increasing accuracy.

Music

This half term we will be listening to the music of Vaughn Williams and John Williams. We will be learning more about the families of instruments within the orchestra. We will continue to use our voices expressively as we learn new songs. When playing musical instruments, we will be focussing on dynamics.

Art

We will look at landscapes, including by the artists J.M.W.
Turner and John
Ndambo. We will explore how artists use warm and cool colours in their paintings.

Read school reading book with an adult at least 3 x per week. Short (5-10 minute) sessions are best
