

Year 1 – Powerful Plants

Spring 2 Curriculum Newsletter











Maths

This half term we are moving on to applying our place value knowledge to even larger numbers—up to 50! We will think carefully about the tens and ones in larger numbers and how to compare and order them. A big focus for us will be counting in 2s and 5s all the way to 100 (and back again to 0) so any practice you can do of this at home will really help with the children's confidence!

Geography

Our Geography will focus on modern-day London— where it is, some of its famous landmarks, its diversity, and why people visit London today.

PE

Our focus this half term is: FUNS7 Counter Balance **FUNS9** Coordination

RE

Focussing on the concept of 'Welcoming' we will be learning about why the concept of welcoming is important in the story of Palm Sunday, and how Christians recreate that welcome today.

Phonics

We will continue learning Phase 5 graphemes, which give us alternate spellings for sounds we already know. Keep practising with your flashcards, reading books and on Bug Club!

PSHE

In this term's topic of Money and Work, we will think about how everyone has different strengths and interests, and how different strengths and interests are needed for different jobs. We will learn about a range of jobs and careers, including some special visitors during the term!

Science

We will start learning about plants including recognising and identifying common flowering plants and trees. We will continue our exploration into the four seasons and the changes that occur in spring.

Computing

In computing, we are learning about data and information. We will learn how to put objects into groups and label these groups. We will then begin to demonstrate our new skills by sorting objects into different groups, based on the properties they choose and answer questions about this

English

Our text this half term is Pattan's Pumpkin by Chitra Soundar. In this adaptation of a traditional tale from Kerala in Southern India, Pattan and his wife grow a pumpkin which comes to their rescue when a flood threatens life in their valley. We will be exploring the features of other traditional tales and writing our own version of the story. We will continue to focus on building the children's stamina for writing and accurate use of sentence punctuation. The children will apply their ever-growing phonetic knowledge to their writing as we concentrate on using alternative spellings for sounds.

Music

This term we will be listening to Elizabethan music and making links between instruments then and orchestral instruments today. We will develop our skills at moving in time to the pulse and keeping a steady pulse with untuned percussion.

DT

In D.T. this term we will be exploring moving parts and learning how to make a slider mechanism. Our finished product will be a 'Magic Slider' greetings card that will include a moving part.
